- a. **Meeting I:** September 29, 2020 – Quarter 1 / Beginning-of-Year
 - i. Identification/Election of members and officers
 - 1. Chair – Cameron McLaughlin

 - ii. Introduction to School Performance Framework (SPF)
 - 1. This school year, there was a pause. GOAL High School stayed in the performance range.
 - 2. 83.6% of eligible to return students. (improves every year)
 - 3. Focus on drop outs
 - iii. Introduction to Unified Improvement Plan (UIP) - Karla
 - 1. As a performance school, we will not be updating the UIP this school year. However we will continue with the same expectations.
 - a. Strengthening school culture
 - b. Instructional model
 - c. Aligning resources to meet academic needs
 - 2. Renewal of charter based on the APR/SPF.
 - a. Star 360, EOY assessments – use this as the data to show growth and to demonstrate good standing.
 - 3. Are we all headed in the same direction with the same goals? Is our school board in compliance with training? Are our finances in good shape – are we solvent and sound? GOAL is doing well and are in good standing, we are in compliance, and we expect to continue with a rating that reflects this compliance.
 - iv. **Strategic Plan Quarterly Review**

1. Strategic Planning Sub Committee – Final Meeting held 9/23/20 to provide update.
 - a. **Where we left off** - last year we had a breakoff group. That group did amazing work trying to pull out the best pieces of the current strategic plan to carry it forward. COVID brought concerns about survey administration in relation to 5-year plan. Specific, measurable, and data-driven.
 - b. **Strategic Plan Pivot** - the pivot was to identify the objectives in each of the major categories in each of the major departments. We worked with each department leader to identify areas of foundational improvement for the school.
 - c. **Work to Date**
 - i. [One Page Strategic Plan](#) - information regarding objectives in each major area of school operations. Areas in italics represent commitments from department leaders to carry out those goals.
 - ii. Objectives and Timeline Commitments - staff and timelines have been identified in order to work on and achieve these goals. We need to establish baseline data, measure progress, and pivot when and if needed.
 - d. **What is next?** Taking all of the relevant data and putting it into the strategic plan for year one. At the end of year one, the bulk will stay in place, but we will adjust or pivot as necessary. A living document that is being reviewed and updated on a regular basis to reflect our commitments, teams, objectives, and data. *The version linked here is a draft and is not for widespread release at this time. It needs to undergo board approval.*
- v. CTE and Workforce Update - Special Guest Juliet McWilson
 1. Our CTE course offerings and statewide partnerships are expanding, and they are crucial to GOAL and our programs. How can we support the program and get our students engaged? How can we champion CTE?
 2. Provided a presentation to discuss programming and partnerships. CTE aligns technical standards and academic expectations.; a concentration on knowledge and skills, supports a seamless pathway to post-secondary pursuits like certifications, apprenticeships, traditional college, etc. At GOAL we provide several pathway programs; these are outlines for students to follow in their time at GOAL, and beyond GOAL as they move forward. Allow students to explore potential opportunities and passions. They gain technical skills, industry certifications, and college credits. This is open to ALL students – ALP, IEP, ELL, general populations - everyone is welcome to explore and get inspired!
 3. 6 Career Clusters established by the community college system; we offer courses in 5 of these areas:
 - a. Agriculture, Natural Resources & Energy
 - b. STEM, Arts, Design & Information Technology
 - i. In person IT lab in COSprings; coding, HTML; MTA; Microsoft certifications; JAVA; COMP TIA; **PAID**

INTERNSHIPS @ GOAL. Pathways feature a sequence of courses.

- c. Skilled Trades & Technical Sciences
 - d. Health Science, Criminal Justice & Public Safety
 - i. Want to give students a better/more realistic view of which health careers exist.
 - ii. Catherine Wells – Criminal justice Cert.
 - iii. Designing new courses for ventures to incorporate new skills and career pathways.
 - e. **5. Hospitality, Human Services & Education- GOAL does not currently have. ECE, food services, etc. These are taken through CE.**
 - f. 6. Business, Marketing & Public Administration
 - i. Expanded offerings – some courses count for English elective credit! Potentially accounting/quick books in 2021-2022. Looking for digital media courses to pair with GOAL internships.
4. Multi-Craft Core Curriculum (MC3) – apprenticeships programs at GOAL! Fantastic for students who love to work with their hands (Mr. Carl Christensen is teaching it this year).
5. Colorado “Hot Jobs” - which industries are hiring? What is current student interest? This is how we determine which programs to focus on.
- vi. Drop Out Prevention – Sub Committee**
- 1. Explore different ways to administer early interventions
 - 2. Focus on family engagement – two-way parent communication is key!
 - 3. Exploring strategies to mentor, provide service learning,
 - 4. Engaging all students in active learning, such as CTE.
 - 5. They have barriers or they don’t know it’s an option – how do we broaden their horizons?
 - 6. Create systemic approaches to school-community collaboration
